AMEND MY NOMINATION

Your nomination gives you six months to submit your PR application to IRCC. You must apply to IRCC before your nomination expires. (The expiry date is noted on the Confirmation of Nomination.) Under certain circumstances, you may request an extension of your original nomination beyond the six-month validity period. This will give you additional time to submit a complete PR application. There is no guarantee that GNB will issue an extension. If granted, you are only allowed one extension. This extension will expire six months after the expiry date on the original nomination. GNB does not grant extensions after one year from the original nomination date. After one year, you will have to submit a new application and meet program requirements. GNB must receive an extension request prior to the expiry of your original nomination.

ISSUE A LETTER OF SUPPORT FOR A WORK PERMIT

A principal applicant who has a Confirmation of Nomination and is employed or has a job offer from a New Brunswick company may be issued a work permit by IRCC. Employers must pay a compliance fee of \$230 through the [IRCC Employer Portal](#) before you submit an application for a work permit.

SUBMIT REQUIRED DOCUMENTS, AS APPLICABLE (pdf format)

- NB-004 Employer Support Form
- Confirmation of current employment (employer letter, pay stubs, etc.)
- Copies of current and/or expired work permit(s)
- Proof of legal status in Canada
- Proof your permanent resident application was submitted to IRCC within the validity of the nomination
- Correspondence from IRCC
- New Express Entry profile number and job seeker validation code

PRINCIPAL APPLICANT DECLARATION
